# TOWN OF STERLING BOARD OF SELECTMEN September 5, 2018

**MEETING:** 

Chairman Lane called the Board of Selectmen meeting to order at 6:30 pm. Roll Call: Selectman Kilcoyne – Present. Selectman Cranson – Present. Chairman Lane – Present.

Minutes

Selectman Cranson moved to approve the amended minutes of August 22, 2018. Selectman Kilcoyne 2<sup>nd</sup>. Selectman Kilcoyne – Aye. Selectman Cranson – Aye. Chairman Lane – Aye. Motion Carried.

Selectman Cranson moved to approve the Executive meeting minutes of August 22, 2018, regarding DPW litigation and Conservation litigation, not to be published until the matters are resolved. Selectman Kilcoyne 2<sup>nd</sup>. Selectman Kilcoyne – Aye. Selectman Cranson – Aye. Chairman Lane – Aye. Motion Carried.

PUBLIC HEARING Propane gas at 32 Chocksett John Mazeika, Branch Manager of Osterman Propane, addressed the Board regarding the request by Prime Wellness, 32 Chocksett Road, for propane tanks on the property. The request is for 12 (8 gallon) above ground tanks and 6 (1000 gallon) underground storage tanks. This request has been approved by the Fire Department. After discussion, Selectman Cranson moved to approve the request for 96 gallons of aboveground, propane storage and 6000 gallons of underground propane storage at Prime Wellness, 32 Chocksett Road. Recreation Committee Appointment After discussion, Selectman Cranson moved to appoint Deidre Shapiro as a member of the Recreation Committee with her term to expire on June 30, 2021. The grant, which was to be discussed, was determined to be inappropriate for the Town of Sterling.

40B South Meadow Village Mass Housing Partnership has sent a notice regarding the proposed 40B project at 81 Chace Hill Rd for 8 buildings, with a total of 16 dwelling units. The applicant is Taniel Bedrosian.

As part of the Mass Housing review, input from Resident, Boards, Committees and Town officials is being solicited. The Town Administrator will collect input from all parties, prior to the end of the month. The Town Administrator will verify the accuracy of the State's tally of Affordable Housing within the Town of Sterling. If the Town has met the 10% bench mark, the ZBA may deny the application.

If, and when an application is submitted for a comprehensive permit, assistance may be available. (The Massachusetts Housing Partnerships' Ch. 40B Technical Assistance Program administers grants to municipalities for up to \$15,000.00 to engage qualified third-party consultants to work with the Town's ZBA in reviewing Chapter 40B proposals).

**Fair Permits** 

After discussion, Selectman Cranson moved that the Board approve the following Common Victualler permits for the Sterling Town Fair: Wachusett Chamber Choir, Red Barn Cookies and Poppies Fresh Onion Rings. # 1835 Town Hall Update

A status report was submitted by Bob Jones, Chairman of the 1835 Town Hall Committee.

- Elevator shaft construction, in progress.
- Roof structure has temporarily halted
- O It has been determined that the structural connection between the 1835 building and the 1893 addition is unsound. The Committee is now reviewing options to reinforce the connective structure at or near the junction of the original 1835 and 1893 added sections.
- O The added structural requirements will require additional funding. The Committee plans to use the \$100,000 grant from the Massachusetts Cultural Facilities Fund to cover additional costs associated with the structural repairs needed. With one caveat; the Committee must file a project design and budget with the Massachusetts Historical Commission for approval, prior to the money being released. Therefore, the remedies to the structure would need to conform to MHC requirements for historical preservation.
- O Due to the delays, this project is unable to meet current completion expectations. Barring further complications, it is expected that the 1835 Town Hall Roof Project will be complete in January of 2019.

The Board of Selectmen is very concerned about this latest delay and the need for additional funding. The consensus of the Board was that they wish to meet with the architect/designer and the 1835 Town Hall Committee, in order to discuss the project details and the fiscally sound decisions that must be made.

#### **Collection Bins**

Resident, Laura Ricci, addressed the Board regarding the citizen's petition that she is spear-heading for the next Annual Town Meeting. Each of the Board of Selectmen stated that none of their constituents have expressed concern over collection bins within Town. Therefore, they are reticent to make that a priority. However, during discussion, Ms. Ricci was encouraged to write her petition as a by-law, in order to regulate collection bins on both public and private property. After further discussion, Chairman Lane asked Ms. Ricci if she understood the process and she replied that she did.

#### One Day Alcohol

There were no one day alcohol permit applications for consideration.

### Personnel:

Last week, while responding to an opioid overdose situation two Sterling Police Officers were exposed to fentanyl. They were taken to the hospital and subsequently released. I'm please to report that they are OK.
