## BOARD OF SELECTMEN MINUTES August 15, 2012

MEETING:

Chairman Sushchyk called the meeting to order at 7:01 PM. Roll call established that Selectman Paul Sushchyk, Ronald Furmaniuk and Brian Patacchiola were all present. Selectman Sushchyuk made the motion to go into Executive session. The public was asked to leave the room.

The public meeting resumed at 7:40.

Chairman Sushchyk declared the Sterling Lancaster Television as the only official electronic copy of the meeting.

**MINUTES** 

Selectman Sushchyk made the motion to approve the Agenda. Selectman Furmanick 2<sup>nd</sup> the motion. All in Favor.

Selectman Sushchyk announced that the Primary Election is on Thursday, September 6<sup>th</sup>. Polls open at 7am and close at 8pm. This Friday, Aug. 17 the Town Clerk's Office will stay open from 7:30 am until 8:00pm. It is the deadline to register to vote or to change political party for this Primary Election.

Police Report

Chief Chamberlain presented the official Police report for July 2012. The chief reported that:

there is a vacancy for a part-time dispatcher

Karen Gaylord has retired as his Administrative Assistant and she was

commended for her years of service.

Leominster Crossing needs immediate attention to help alleviate the potential danger that exists. The Town and the State will meet in order to find a permanent solution. In the meanwhile, the Chief suggests rumble strips and additional signs in order to warn motorists.

Senior Center Building Committee Up-date

Maureen Cranson, Karen Philips and Dick Maki represented the Senior Center Bldg committee. They reported that the perk tests were successfully completed on the proposed sight for the future Senior Center (Muddy Pond Rd/Boutelle Rd) They presented the conceptual plan and ANR for the septic system. Updated plans were sent to the DCR for their input on the design of the septic system The next phase is to investigate costs for OPM and architect so that the Building Committee can sponsor an article in the upcoming Special Town Meeting.

Senior Center Report

Karen Philips reported that the, to date, 268 different Sterling Seniors have utilized the Senor Center. This information was gathered by means of MY SENIOR CENTER software that was implemented. She also reported that she has received resumes for the part time for the Outreach worker position. The COA Board will be conducting interviews.

Solar Project

Harald Sheid discussed the PILOT program. Payment in Lieu of Taxes in regard to the solar project that is proposed for Wiles Rd. He reported that it is in the Town's best interest to negotiate an agreement that is equitable for both the Town and the developer since the Towns' residents will also benefit from reduced rates for electricity.

**VOTE:** Selectman Sushchyk made a motion to appoint Selectman Brian Patacchiola, Terri Ackerman and Harald Sheid to represent the Town and to negotiate with the developer. Selectman Furmaniuk 2<sup>nd</sup> the motion. Selectman

Sushchyk and Selectman Furmaniuk – Aye. Selectman Patacchiola Abstained from the vote.

**VOTE:** Selectman Sushchyk made a motion that will allow the negotiating team to come to terms that are equitable for both the Town and the Developer. Selectman Furmaniuk 2<sup>nd</sup> the motion. Selectman Sushchyk and Selectman Furmaniuk – Aye. Selectman Patacchiola Abstained from the vote.

## Administrators Up-date

The roof repairs have been completed on the 1835 Town Hall and the barriers around the building can be removed.

The purchase and sales agreement for 19 Hardscrabble Rd is going to the seller and the announcement is going in the Central Register.

The money from House Bill 4235 has been approved. The Town will receive \$420,000 which will be used by the DPW for resurfacing and other projects. The school budget has been finalized and Sterling will be assess \$149,000 less than was approved at the Town Meeting.

Code Red had a successful test run. There is an 80% Connection rate. 700 more residents have signed up for the service.
