MEETING:

Chair Cranson called the Select Board meeting to order at 6:33pm. Roll Call: Chair Cranson - Present. Select member Sonnenberg - Present. Select member Kilcoyne - present.

Also present were Town Administrator, Kellie Hebert and Senior Executive Assistant, Kama Jayne.

Minutes

Select member Kilcoyne moved to approve the minutes of March 31, 2021. Select member Sonnenberg 2nd. Chair Cranson – Aye. Select member Sonnenberg – Aye. Select Member Kilcoyne – Aye. Motion Carried.

State legislative updates

State delegates, Senator John Cronin, State Representative Kimberly Ferguson and State Representative Meghan Kilcoyne addressed the Board. They discussed the budget and promised to assist the Town of Sterling in getting "their fair share" in appropriate state funding. They will continue to advocate for 100% reimbursement for the cost of busing in Regional school districts. Further, the Board requested that they;

- Check into the availability of the million dollar bond for the Lake Waushacum renovations, which was part of the 2018 Environmental Bond Bill.
- Consider ways to develop a more fair and equitable formula for the funding of small town infrastructure.
- Pursue Federal Funding for Covid Relief
- Help Sterling to address its pending water shortages by advocating for the Town to draw from the Wachusett Reservoir.
- Do away with the prevailing wage requirements in small towns.

The Town recently received a \$40,000.00 grant that will be used to install security cameras in the Municipal building.

Antique permits

After discussion, Select member Kilcoyne moved to approve the Antique permits for the following: Nouveaux Riches, Everett Pierce, Oh My Gosh Antiques and Collectibles, Pratts Junction Antiques, Sterling Rare Coin, and Redemption Rock Trading Post. Select member Sonnenberg 2nd. Chair Cranson – Aye. Select member Sonnenberg – Aye. Select Member Kilcoyne – Aye. Motion Carried.

Master Plan reorganization Town Planner, Domenica Tatasciore reported to the Board that when the Master Plan Committee members were recently asked to confirm their FY22 appointments, a significant number of members declined their June reappointments. With the current existing Committee structure/size, a lack of quorum would result from this drop in membership. Since the MP Committee is now in the goal setting phase of the master planning process, it must continue to meet monthly in order to have this plan finalized by December 2021/January 2022. Therefore, she proposed that the membership of the Master Plan Committee be reduced from twelve (12) to seven (7) members;

She further proposed that those seven (7) members shall consist of board and committee liaisons in addition to Topic Chairs. A quorum of the Master Plan Committee shall consist of a simple majority of committee members, of which one (1) member shall be either the Chair, Vice Chair or Clerk.

The proposed executive membership shall consist of:

- One (1) Select Board member, appointed by the Select Board;
- One (1) Planning Board member, appointed by the Planning Board;
- One (1) Land Use Topic Chair, recommended by said Topic Team;
- One (1) Housing Topic Chair, recommended by said Topic Team;
- One (1) Natural & Cultural Resources Topic Chair, recommended by said Topic Team;

- One (1) Open Space & Recreation Topic Chair, recommended by said Topic Team;
- One (1) Services & Facilities Topic Chair, recommended by said Topic Team.

After discussion, Select Member Sonnenberg moved to reduce the Master Plan Committee from twelve to 7 executive members. Those members shall consist of one (1) Select Board member, one (1) Planning Board member, one (1) Land Use Topic Chair, one (1) Housing Topic Chair, one (1) Natural & Cultural Resources Topic Chair, one (1) Open Space & Recreation Topic Chair, and one (1) Services & Facilities Topic Chair. Select member Kilcoyne 2nd. Chair Cranson – Aye. Select member Sonnenberg – Aye. Select Member Kilcoyne – Aye. Motion Carried.

Disband Housing Initiatives Committee

The Board received notification that the Housing Initiatives Committee has accomplished their goal of identifying possible locations for future affordable housing development. Having completed their mission, the Committee suggested disbandment. Therefore, Select member Kilcoyne moved to disband the Housing Initiatives Committee. Select member Sonnenberg 2nd. Chair Cranson – Aye. Select member Sonnenberg – Aye. Select Member Kilcoyne – Aye. Motion Carried.

The Board will consider the recommendations of the Housing Initiative's Committee at a future meeting.

List of Warrant Articles and updates

The Town administrator presented a preliminary draft of the list of warrant articles for the Annual Town Meeting. The organization, consolidation and wording will be decided at future meetings.
