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
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### Senior Spotlight by Maureen Cranson

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### HOMAGE TO THE PAST: AMERICAN FOLK ART PAINTINGS by Diane Ulmer Pedersen

Although Diane is a trained artist, she has painted in a style reminiscent of the early 1800s since the 1970s. It all started with a few folk art portraits of children that she created for the antique and decorating shop she worked in after college. Once she started studying the artwork and crafts of that era, she was drawn to the stylizations,



colors and finishes, and the spirit they evoked. Her subjects expanded over the years to include landscapes, still lives, animals — many inspired by verses from the Bible. She paints in acrylics and overlays an oil glaze or crackled finish to add an old patina. Then she sets many of her works in hand-painted, faux grained frames.

Over the years her work has been licensed for framed prints, two wallpaper books, rugs, pillows, coasters, collector plates, cards & calendars, puzzles, tapestries and throws, and just recently for needlepoint scrims. She has exhibited in arts and craft festivals in the Northeast, as well as libraries, schools, restaurants, and with the Princeton Arts Society.

Bring the following documents with you to the appointment:

Picture ID, SS card and dates of birth for all household members

Proof of address for person whose name is on the heating bill, eg utility, telephone or cable bill

Heating Bill <u>and</u> Electric Bill with name and service address on the bills

Rental info such as lease, rent, and full name, address of landlord or ownership info such as mortgage statement and water bill

If own home, bring property tax bill, homeowners insurance, and water bill

Proof of income for all household members for the prior 4 weeks



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
