RABIES INFORMATION

RABIES INFORMATION

The Animal Control Officer wants to remind Sterling residents **about the importance of keeping** your domesticated pets updated on their rabies shots! **Massachusetts state law requires that all dogs be licensed, and requires proof of rabies vaccination prior to licensing.** Also, if your dog or cat runs off **and returns** with a wound of unknown origin, there **is a required minimum** automatic six month quarantine period. **A worst case scenario would require euthanizing your pet.** Even indoor cats and small dogs can sneak out the door when you least expect it. Leaving your dog tied up outside while you are at work, or relying on an underground fence system is not a good idea because the dog cannot protect itself from wildlife that could be sick or dangerous. Rabies is transmitted through contact with an infected animal's saliva, usually through a bite, scratch or through contact with an infected animal's nervous tissue (brain and spinal cord). Animals that pose the greatest risk for transmitting rabies include: raccoons, skunks, woodchucks, foxes, coyotes, bats and stray domesticated animals.

MICRO-CHIP INFORMATION

It is very important all dog owners make sure their dogs micro-chips are registered with complete and updated information!

The Sterling ACO does have a micro-chip scanner which reads all chips. Without charge, he will gladly check your micro-chip registration details and/or confirm micro-chip registration information. Interested persons can call: 978-422-7331 and request to speak to the ACO for an appointment. Also, be aware that when getting a micro-chip put in your dog's neck area make sure you ask your veterinarian, "Is the micro-chip readable by all micro-chip scanners?" A good chip that is readable by all micro-chip scanners is the brand name **MICROFINDR**.
