Please be advised that issue with the septic system located at 22 Rast Park Drive, is being actively worked on to get the system to the point that it is operating as it needs to be working in order to be safe, benithy for all parties concerned.

As background information, some in September, I noticed that there was a smell of what seemed to be waste in Spetember of 2012. At that time, I did nontact Mike Cove, since he was the septic installer. Since that time, we have been working together to determine what the issue was and how to best resolve the issue.

To determine the issue, Wike did perform the following work at no cost to ma:

1. Dye Test - To determine which bathroom(s) were not hooked into the new system. The test was performed in all 4 bathrooms and revealed that just one bathroom was not properly hooked in

2. Discovery Excavation - Mas performed to determine whet athe mising pipe was and to determine If it could be hooked up into the new system.

Unfortunately, the pipe is too low in the ground, since water will not run uphill, we needed to come up with some alternative ways of getting the bathroom hooked in the new system. Once again, at no cost to me, the following step have been taken to correct the issue:

1. Plumbers where brought in to brain storm ideas, such as putting a pump in and other such ideas

2. Run a new line from inside the house to get the bathroom properly hooked in

We are pursuing running a new line. At this point, a new trench has been dug inside the house. I am aware and will ensure that permits as well as whatever other paperwork that may be required will be properly obtained.

While this has taken longer than any one would like, the delays have been a combination of mother nature, me not being able be home, as well as Mike having other jobs he is working on.
