Public Session: A resident wanted the DPW Board to be aware of the deteriorating condition of Osgood Road.

- Equipment trailer specs- 20 foot c channel skid steer. Aluminum trailer vs a steel trailer- The aluminum trailer does not require a CDL class A license because it keeps the weight under 10,000 lbs. Two five foot ramps store inside the trailer.

  - Open house- good weather and a lot of work from the DPW to get trucks and buildings ready made for a successful day
  - o The street sweeping, which is on-going is widening the roads
  - o Two water main breaks- one on April 27th and May 2nd- Redstone area
  - o Crack sealing beginning on the May 19th
  - o Putting together a bid package for Kendall Hill Road
  - o Seasonal workers- 2 right now and 2 more candidates coming
  - o Gentleman contacted office, stating he was interested in the Mechanic position
  - o DPW crew working to get cemeteries and downtown ready for Memorial Day
  - Water department to continuing hydrant flushing
