Year to date budget reports

- Handouts were available listing cost through Warrant #7 for DPW and Water.
- DPW 36.3% of budget spent includes line painting and flashing signs Water 37.6% without indirect cost. Electricity and chemicals are high due to increased prices. Board will review reports and will discuss at future meetings.

Water Rules and Regulations- Handed out copies of Water Rules and Regulations for the DPW Board to review.

 Over the last few weeks the DPW Board have been reviewing the Water Rules and Regulations and have given their input and will be finalized by Mr. Mouradian and the new Water Forman Michael Tomaiolo. The Rules and Regulations will be presented separately from any fee increases.

Proposed New DPW Facility Locations

- Options for the updated facility considered 2 locations: The current location (171 Worcester Street) and behind the Police station (George Peeso Lane)
- 3 models were presented for each site—these drawing don't have provisions for a septic system. The curren site will be tight, but the location is good.

- Water Meters- Awaiting transmitters told we should see 500 in November and 500 in December
- Crowley Road- pumping test underway
- Campground Water Main Replacement- will have specs within the next couple of months, then going out to bid
- o Redstone Water Main Replacement- 60% design received and under review
- o Employee reviews completed-Michael Tomaiolo promoted to Water Forman
