Trends and Comparisons in Survey Results

Consistent Issues Across 2007 and 2002 Surveys

- Protection of water resources is the most important issue based on results in both surveys. Note 2002 Survey had many more items focused on this issue
- ➤ Protection preservation of Sterling's rural/historic character including farms and agriculture is the second most important issue. Many comments tended to focus on this constellation of issues

Trends and Comparisons in Survey Results, cont'd

Emerging Issues on 2007 Survey

- Maintenance of recreational resources including sidewalks, playing fields, town beach and other properties. Again many comments focused on this constellation of issues
- Walking on road was a preferred activity as noted in responses to several questions. Comments focused on safety concerns due to poor repair or lack of sidewalks
