# TOWN OF STERLING Select Board Meeting July 7, 2020

**MEETING:** 

Chairman Kilcoyne, called the Select Board meeting to order at 6:29pm. Roll Call: Selectman Cranson – Present. Select member Sonnenberg – Participated remotely. Chairman Kilcoyne – Present. Also present were Town Administrator, Ross Perry and Senior Executive Assistant, Kama Jayne.

Minutes

Selectman Cranson moved to approve the minutes of June 25, 2020. Select member Sonnenberg 2<sup>nd</sup>. Selectman Cranson – Aye. Select member Sonnenberg – Aye. Chairman Kilcoyne – Aye. Motion Carried.

Reorganization

Chairman Kilcoyne moved that Maureen Cranson be appointed as Chairman and Arden Sonnenberg be appointed as Vice Chair and that he, himself, be appointed as Clerk. Select member Sonnenberg, 2<sup>nd</sup>. Selectman Kilcoyne – Aye. Select Member Sonnenberg – Aye. Selectman Cranson – Aye. Motion carried.

TA Job Posting

Selectman Kilcoyne moved to post the vacancy for the Town Administrator position immediately, with a cut-off date of August 10th. Select member Sonnenberg 2<sup>nd</sup>. Selectman Kilcoyne – Aye. School Committee Appointment

Conservation Beach area Update

Conservation Agent, Matt Marro reported Whitman and Bingham have completed their survey work and within 60 days will submit proposals to upgrade the drainage issues that have plagued the Swett Hill/Hall Ave/Beach area. The Town is looking for a solution to relieve the heavy burden of storm water

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run-off, before it moves to the Lake. The Conservation Commission is seeking the best and most cost effective solution. The Select Board will be kept apprised of the progress.

# State funding requests

After discussion, Selectman Kilcoyne moved that the Town Administrator submit a detailed request for funding to Senator Tran's office. Select Member Sonnenberg 2<sup>nd</sup>. Chairman Cranson – Aye. Select member Sonnenberg – Aye. Selectman Kilcoyne - Aye. Motion Carried. The funding requests will include items from the Capital Committee request list, DPW infrastructure priorities, the 1835 Town Hall septic connection, full funding for Chapter 90 money and out-of-district transportation cost for students.

### Tag sale

Jane Morgan has requested that there be a weekly tag/flea market sale in the Town center. After discussion, the Board requested that she come back to them with a proposal that would include: Who is responsible for this endeavor? Where is it to be held? (The proposed area by the Select Board was the back parking lot at the Butterick Building). Time? Who will ensure clean up each week? Will there be a charge for table set up? Etc.

This will be discussed at the August 5<sup>th</sup> meeting.

# Entrances to Public Ways

The Board considered the approval of a curb cut for 65 Beaman Road. The application was approved by the DPW, Fire Department, and Building Commissioner. After discussion, Selectman Kilcoyne moved to approve the Entrance To Public Ways permit request for 65 Beaman Road. Select member Sonnenberg 2nd. Chairman Cranson – Aye. Selectman Kilcoyne – Aye. Select member Sonnenberg – Aye. Motion Carried. All departmental conditions must be met.

The Board considered the approval of permits for Entrance to Public Ways for 81 & 83 Maple Street. The application was approved by the DPW, Fire Department, and Building Commissioner. #### **TA Report**

#### **Town Administrator Report 7/8/20**

#### **Town Hall Operations**

- Similar to last report, it is open to the public, by appointment. Masks must be worn.
- All visitors will logged in on sheets in each office visited by the staff member visited. This will be to assist any COVID-19 tracing should it be necessary
- Pending further developments, Town Hall could be open to the public August 3<sup>rd</sup>, subject to wearing masks and using hand sanitizer upon entry.

#### 1835 Building:

- As mentioned before, the Sprinkler system has been installed.
- The Recreation Director is planning to schedule a Babysitters' course with CPR on the first floor August 17 10:00-2:00
- The 1835 Committee has a quote to sand and refinish the hardwood floors in the Great room on the second floor for \$8500. These floor have years and years of wear and need this work. This will be a great improvement to the appearance of the building and facilitate future use. I propose to fund this project from the Facilities Expense account. This account could be reimbursed from the EDC Expense account if the EDC so votes, or via a warrant article at a fall special town meeting if one occurs. In the meantime, Facilities Expense account can absorb this cost and the Board's vote to proceed with the floor work would be appropriate.

#### **Financial Policies:**

- When FY 21 budget was finalized with efforts to reduce the tax rate by using Stabilization funds
  and reducing the contribution to the OPEB account, there was an acknowledgement that these
  funds should be replaced, thus avoiding a negative impact on the Town's bond rating.
- I have sent you a repayment plan starting with a modest amount in FY 22 and then increasing with a final payment in FY 27. I propose to fund these payments from Free Cash thus avoiding a direct increase to the tax rate. However, these payments will reduce the amount of Free Cash available for capital projects.
- I will ask the Finance Committee at their next meeting to review these addendums to the Financial Policy Manual and the Board to vote on these changes at a subsequent meeting. In the meantime, send me your comments.
