

Many of the essays are responses to writing group prompts, while others are a reaction to current events, life questions or refreshed memories.

Several pieces have appeared in other publications, including Sterling Meetinghouse News, The Landmark, The Bolton Independent, The Harvard Press, MUSED BellaOnline Literary Review and Adelaide Literary Magazine.

Tatten tells his stories with a recognizable, distinct voice,
