





Historical Model Trains Now Alive in a Sterling Collection Tuesday January 14th, 9:00 am





Celebrate Slim Wronski's 100th Birthday! Thursday January 9th Luncheon at 11:30am Reservations Required All invited for cake at 12:15pm

Lifelong resident Slim (Edmund) Wronski turns 100 on January 4th, 2020!
Slim and his four brothers were raised on Joseph A. Wronski's farm on Redemption Rock Trail in Sterling. They tended the farm using horse drawn cultivators, planters and wagons. The Wronski farm included an ice

house right behind the milk room to store ice, which the family would harvest from the Stillwater River every year.

When Slim and his wife Helen (Wiinikainen) were in their 20s, Slim's father walked with him to a property on Princeton Road. Standing on the hill overlooking the Stillwater River, Slim's father said, "Slim, build a house for Helen here." Every day after work at a wire mill in Worcester, Slim worked on the house with Helen, using hand cut logs for lumber and rocks picked from nearby fields.

Slim worked at Crompton and Knowles in Worcester, and later for the Town of Sterling at the Water Department, the DPW, and as a carpenter. He is known for sharing his knowledge. Slim and Helen raised a girl and two boys, Jean, Richard, and Joe in a well structured and disciplined home environment.

Slim loves fishing, and has taught many others to fish, sharing the flies he tied. He learned to carve wood, and taught many others with Central Mass Caricature Carvers.

Slim still lives at the house he built on Princeton Rd.
