

Parkinson's Support Group Wednesday July 18th 3:30 to 5 PM

The Senior Center will be starting a support group for people with Parkinson's Disease (PD) in Northern Worcester County. The group will be open to anyone with PD and/or their care givers/partners. The meetings will be to share experiences and support each other. Each meeting will end with an optional exercise session with exercises specially designed for people with PD. From time to time we will have drop-in speakers who will tell us about special events and things we "Parkies" can do to help ourselves.

This will be a peer led support group facilitated by Joe O'Connor. A little bit about Joe - a 27 time marathon finisher and RRCA certified running coach, Joe was diagnosed with Parkinson's in December of 2016. He has since been involved in many clinical trials for PD and is very excited about getting a support group going in the north county.

Sterling Lions Club to Introduce Low Vision Rehabilitation Network Thursday July 19th at 6pm

The Sterling Lions Club in conjunction with the Massachusetts Multiple District Lions will introduce the Low Vision Rehabilitation Network (MA-LOVRNET) to seniors in our area at the Sterling Senior Center.



Low vision is a chronic and disabling vision impairment that can't be corrected by glasses, medication or surgery. It is estimated that over 85,000 Massachusetts residents suffer from low vision with 80% being over the age of 65.

MA-LOVRNET is an initiative of the Lions of Massachusetts to identify and link resources to help individuals who are coping with low vision and vision loss typically caused by Macular Degeneration, Glaucoma, Diabetic Retinopathy or Cataracts. It's a cooperative network of optometrists, rehabilitation therapists, mobility specialists, health and service providers, professionals and Lions volunteers that aims to reduce the barriers to receiving appropriate and beneficial low vision rehabilitation services by those who would benefit from them.

The Lions and the Sterling Senior Center are teaming up to provide transportation to this event. If you need a ride, call us at 978 422 3032.

Create a Shrimp Jar with Gregg Billings Wednesday July 11th at 1pm






