
Sherrill Sasser LMT, CAT

The pressure used will be to your comfort level. You remain fully clothed during your ten minute session. You can choose to sit in a massage or office chair. Each session is at an introductory price of \$8.

Known commonly as Fuel Assistance, the Low Income Home Energy Assistance Program (LIHEAP) provides eligible households with help in paying a portion of winter heating bills.

Homeowners and renters including households whose cost of heat is included in the rent can apply - eligibility is based on household size and the gross annual income of every household member 18 years of age or older. A single person with a gross income below \$42,411 or a two-person household with a gross income below \$55,461 can apply.
