Known commonly as Fuel Assistance, the Low Income Home Energy Assistance Program (LIHEAP) provides eligible households with help in paying a portion of winter heating bills. Homeowners and renters including households whose cost of heat is included in the rent can apply. Household income cannot exceed 60% of estimated State Median Income.

A single person with a gross income below \$42,411 or a twoperson household with a gross income below \$55,461 can apply.
