Current Business:

- 1. Discussion of listed artifacts. David Gibbs, Curator Sterling Historical Society will be contacted about any transfers of artifacts.
- 2. For expense reimbursement, forms may be picked up at Sterling Town Hall.
- 3. Decision was made to create a plaque for the Rittenhouse property. The cost is not to exceed \$100. Motion made by J French, 2nd C LaVigne
- 4. Minutes from previous meeting were approved. Motion made by J French, 2nd C Harragian
- 5. Discussion of the mission of the Historical Commission: Some ideas are as follows:
 - Preserve all historical buildings in Sterling
 - Raise public awareness of why historical preservation is important
 - Include historical landscapes under the umbrella of historical preservation in Sterling
 - "Preserve the past for the future"

Old Business:

- 1. Cemetery Project: Look for a work crew to restore Legg cemetery graveyard. This is a very visible project that raises public awareness about the need for historic preservation
- 2. 1835 elevator lift: Solution to outside elevator placement, is to use a cage lift in the existing stairwell. This will provide access to upstairs events for handicapped participants.
- 3. Farmstead survey: Bob is compiling integrated scans
- 4. Historic properties: Historic artifacts in 1835 Town hall need to be inventoried.
- 5. Kristoff property: DCR has not responded to our requests for the former pig farm property letter.
- 6. Stillwater River property: Concern about the weak condition of the barn on this property was raised. As the commission, we do not want to see the loss of another barn in Sterling.
- 7. Carol LaVigne suggested MPPF grants be used for purchasing historical signs.
